

# Acts Part 44

**“Paul’s Farewell Tour, Part 1”**



**1 After the uproar had ceased, Paul sent for the disciples, and when he had encouraged them and taken his leave of them, he left to go to Macedonia. 2 When he had gone through those regions and had given them much encouragement, he came to Greece.**

**3 And *there* he spent three months, and when a plot was formed against him by the Jews as he was about to set sail for Syria, he decided to return through Macedonia.**

**4 And he was accompanied by Sopater of Berea, *the son* of Pyrrhus, and by Aristarchus and Secundus of the Thessalonians, and Gaius of Derbe, and Timothy, and Tychicus and Trophimus of Asia.**

**5 Now these had gone on ahead and were waiting for us at Troas. 6 We sailed from Philippi after the days of Unleavened Bread, and reached them at Troas within five days; and we stayed there for seven days.**

**7 On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul *began* talking to them, intending to leave the next day, and he prolonged his message until midnight.**

**8 There were many lamps in the upstairs room where we were gathered together.**

**9 And there was a young man named Eutychus sitting on the window sill, sinking into a deep sleep; and as Paul kept on talking, *Eutychus* was overcome by sleep and fell down from the third floor, and was picked up dead.**

**10 But Paul went down and fell upon him, and after embracing him, he said, "Do not be troubled, for he is still alive."**

**11** When *Paul* had gone *back* up and had broken the bread and eaten, he talked with them a long while until daybreak, and then left. **12** They took away the boy alive, and were greatly comforted.
